




Current Housing Situation for Students in Munich

The total amount of students in Munich is around 140,000.

However, there are only around **9,000 available places** in the residence halls of Munich Student Union.

TUM does not own or run any halls of residence!





Before the Search – Plan Ahead



- Consider your preferences and limits (location, type of accommodation, price)
- Book temporary accommodation before arriving (<u>youth hostel</u>, airbnb)
- Make sure to plan sufficient time for the search
 - → be at the campus location before the semester/lectures begin
- Be ready to make compromise (commute, higher price at the beginning, sharing flat)





Cold vs. Warm Rent



- Kaltmiete ("Cold rent")
 basic rent for the room/apartment/house
- Warmmiete ("Warmrent")
 rent + additional cost (Nebenkosten)
 (water supply & disposal, trash and recycling pick-up, cleaning service
 (house and street), heating
- + Additional costs: electricity, Internet and TV
- + DEPOSIT (Kaution) ~ up to 3times cold rent
- Abbreviations: Glossary of abbreviations

- Residence halls and Private Accommodation Service of Munich Student Union
- Private residence halls

Getting in Touch

- First contact via phone/email
- Email: introduce yourself, express you interest and state your personal situation



• If invited to an interview, prepare a CV with photo, admission letter / confirmation of enrollment, financial proof (work contract, scholarship or parents' guarantee) or other additional required documents





Scammers – How to Recognize a Scam?

Most scams involve one or more of the following:





- Insistence on communication through a family "lawyer"
- Interview cancelled or postponed last-minute with different excuses
- The feedback is almost always in English (even if the ad was in German)





Scammers – How To Avoid Being Their Victim?

- Insist on meeting landlord/landlady in person
 - → you can avoid the vast majority of scammers by following this rule
- Don't hand over cash or money check/orders
- Do not send copies of your personal ID unless you are certain it is safe to do so
- TUM does not handle private transactions or offer buyer/seller protections



To Do's While Searching for Accommodation



- Spread the word
- Be at the campus location and be active
- Check the ads at various times of the day
- Check your emails frequently (also spam) and make sure to react quickly
- Language: learn and increase your German vocabulary
- Be aware of the intercultural/personal differences
- Be patient and do not get frustrated
- Nice to have: Haftpflichtversicherung(liability insurance), SCHUFA-Auskunft (only if you have lived in Germany)



Flat/Room Viewing



- Make sure to come in time
- Be polite and engaged
- Prepare the documents, which you can leave behind after your viewing appointment

After the Viewing

- Make more appointments
- IMPORTANT: Keep on searching while waiting for feedbacks!



Rental Contract

- Legally binding
- Rights and obligations of landlord and tenants
- Essential Points
 - Name and signature of both landlord and tenant
 - Exact address, available rooms, size of the room/apartment/house
 - Start (and ending) date of contract, notice period
 - Rent, additional costs, deposit and deadlines for payment
 - Refundable deposit (in case of damage): up to 3-months "cold" rent

returned 2-9 months after the end of the tenancy

Read contract thoroughly and then sign

Contract in German → for your residence registration (and residence permit if applicable)





Accommodation Arranged: What To Do Next?



- Registration at the Citizens' Office (Bürgerbüro) at KVR (Department of Public Order) within 2 weeks after moving in
 - You will need a Wohnungsgeberbestätigung (confirmation from the property owner) https://stadt.muenchen.de/en/info/residence-registration.html
- Open a bank account
- Health insurance
- Enrollment at university
- Residence permit* (Foreigner's Office)

^{*}If you are not a citizen of EU/EEA member states you need a residence permit
